

The UCSF Child and Adolescent Support, Advocacy and Resource Center (CASARC) Seeks (Bicultural/Bilingual) HS Clinical Faculty Psychologist

Who we are: Child and Adolescent Support, Advocacy and Resource Center (CASARC)

CASARC is a program of the Division of Trauma Recovery Services (DTRS), which is part of the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital (DPBS; ZSFG). CASARC is a unique multidisciplinary clinic that serves children, youth, and families that have been impacted by sexual abuse, physical abuse, witnessed severe domestic violence or who have a family member who has been a victim of severe interpersonal violence, including family members of homicide victims.

Overview-Job Duties

Under the direct supervision of the Director of the Division of Trauma Recovery Services (DTRS) and the CASARC Clinical Coordinator, the HS Clinical Faculty member takes the lead on developing trainings within the program and supports the delivery of mental health services for the unit. This includes but is not limited to, helping to track and triage referrals, providing clinical consultation to multidisciplinary clinical staff, consulting on and supporting other clinicians with the management of high-risk cases, and helping to inform protocols and procedures. The HS Clinical Faculty will assist with quality improvement projects and utilization review of mental health services. The incumbent will participate in providing in-service trainings for UCSF, DPH, and the surrounding community. The HS Clinical Faculty will coordinate and oversee the doctoral level training program, including recruitment, coordination, supervision, and oversight of training projects (e.g., program evaluation projects). The incumbent will be responsible for creating curriculum for a weekly seminar series on the treatment of childhood sexual abuse. The incumbent will work closely with the CASARC clinical coordinator to organize the overall multidisciplinary clinical training program. The HS Clinical Faculty will work with the Director of DTRS to explore additional funding opportunities and innovate services and treatments provided in order to enhance service provision.

The incumbent will maintain a clinical case load, providing clinical assessment, crisis intervention, individual, play, didactic, group and family therapy, using trauma-focused and evidence-based interventions, clinical case management, and care coordination. Outreach to difficult to reach children, youth and their families is an essential job function.

We provide all staff with weekly supervision and training in order to support professional development and mediate the impact of vicarious trauma.

Ideal Candidates

Bilingual/bicultural, CA licensed psychologists with a strong interest in serving culturally and linguistically-diverse communities of child survivors of sexual abuse. Applicants whose clinical work is informed by cultural humility and a commitment to anti-racist practice.
