Who we are: Trauma Recovery Center

The UCSF Trauma Recovery Center (TRC)/Rape Treatment Center (RTC) is a program of the Division of Trauma Recovery Services (DTRS). DTRS is part of the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital (DPBS; ZSFG). The UCSF TRC is a nationally recognized program whose treatment approach has been codified into legislation and is being replicated across California and nationally.

Overview-Job Duties

The UCSF Health Sciences Clinical Faculty is 70% Clinical and 30% Program Evaluation. This position provides evidence-based/evidence-informed short-term trauma focused therapy and clinical case management, including outreach and engagement, to a caseload of acute survivors of interpersonal violence. Every 8 weeks, clinicians administer a subset of self-report measures to each client. This position conducts a weekly comprehensive diagnostic/psychosocial intake evaluation for clients referred for TRC services.

This position provides weekly on-duty coverage during business hours, which includes crisis management, taking referrals, fielding calls from community providers, and providing clinical consultation and support to TRC clinicians. This position also provides psychological first aid and emergency case management to acute sexual assault survivors seeking medical and/or forensic services at ZSFG Emergency Department during business hours.

As part of program evaluation, the HS Clinical faculty will assist in obtaining extramural funding; they will assist with grant applications and pre and post award writing supportive of TRC's mission. This position helps support the clinic's extensive ongoing program evaluation by working side by side with TRC's data analyst, performing statistical analyses and generating reports on an as needed basis. They will participate with Division leadership in writing manuscripts for peer review journals and will play a role in strategic planning in using our data towards informing policy and treatment interventions. This position will ensure that the clinical measures utilized to evaluate TRC clients and their treatment progress remain current, valid, and reliable measures. They will ensure that these measures are culturally appropriate for our patient population. This position will present TRC outcome data quarterly to our multidisciplinary team as well as prepare presentations as requested for leadership.

The HS Clinical Faculty may participate in the teaching and mentoring of pre-and post-doctoral fellows and trainees from the UCSF Clinical Psychology Training Program and/or CAPIC training.

Ideal Candidates

Bilingual/bicultural, CA licensed psychologists with a strong interest in serving culturally and linguistically-diverse communities of adult survivors of violence. Demonstrated understanding of the trauma of interpersonal violence in a broader societal context, including the ways that structural racism / sexism / homophobia and systemic inequities have perpetuated cycles of violence and barriers to care in underserved communities. Applicants whose clinical work is informed by cultural humility and a commitment to anti-racist practice.
